## Outlook

10.79 Sustained and high levels of economic growth in recent years provide an unique opportunity and momentum for faster social sector development. The buoyant economy should not only generate adequate employment but also provide adequate and need based resources for large interventions in the critical areas of social sector. The recent resurgence of manufacturing also bodes well for employment generation.

10.80 Availability of resources alone, however, will not guarantee faster social sector development. Efficacy of the programmes will depend a lot on the manner in which States implement various social sector programmes, these primarily being in the domain of the States. Time bound achievement of the physical targets will depend a lot on the capacity mobilization of the States at various levels. Accountability and transparency, especially through the PRIs, need to be emphasized to ensure good governance and delivery of quality services through public action for most social sector programmes. Capacity building of PRIs themselves is a critical success factor to achieve these objectives. States must ensure availability of adequate and skilled manpower for PRIs which are crucial for effective implementation of the social sector programmes like the NREGS. Monitoring the progress and effective implementation of the various social sector schemes through the outcome budget along with Right to Information Act and decentralization through the PRIs are expected to strengthen the process of inclusive growth.
