- 1. The provision is for expenditure of Secretariat of the Department of Drinking Water Supply.
- 2. The Government is committed to assist the State Governments towards provision of drinking water to all rural habitations in the country by accelerating the pace of implementation of the programme. To this effect the Government has been progressively increasing the annual Central outlay for the rural water supply sector over the years. Measures to institutionalise community participation in planning, implementing, managing, operating and maintaining the rural water supply schemes are being tried out in selected pilot districts across the country on experimental basis.
  - The Government continues to give upmost importance

in supplementing the efforts of the State Governments to provide sanitation facilities to the rural masses. In order to provide focussed attention to the Environmental Sanitation in the rural areas, the Central rural Sanitation Programmes has been restructured with effect from 1.4.99 and is being implemented initially in the identified 100 pilot districts on a demand driven approach. It is community led and people centered. Rural School Sanitation has been introduced as major component and as an entry point encouraging wider acceptance of sanitation by the rural masses. It is now being implemented in a project mode. It is designed to suit district specific requirements.
