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- 1. **Secretariat Social Services :** Provides for secretariat expenditure.
- 2. **Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan:** Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan is a Central autonomous body of the ministry which has Nehru Yuva Kendras in the districts functioning under it. It is the largest grass root level organisation in Asia-Pacific region, catering to more than 8 million youth in the age group of 15-35 yrs. This organisation is mainly working for giving extra thrust to the activities of non-student rural youth through programmes such as youth leadership, training, community service programmes, vocational training, sports and recreation, cultural activities, nonformal education, etc.
- 3. National Service Scheme: The scheme started in 1969-70 is implemented through universities, colleges and other institutions of higher learning. Expenditure on the scheme is shared on 7:5 basis between the Government of India and the States except in case of Government of J&K and UTs without legislature where the entire expenditure is met by the Central Government. The National Service Scheme has two types of programmes, viz. "Regular Activities" and Special Camping Programes" undertaken by its volunteers. Under "Regular Activities", students are expected to work as volunteers for a continuous period of two years, rendering community service for a minimum of 120 hours per annum. The activities include improvement of Campuses, Tree Plantation, Constructive work in adopted villages and slums, work in welfare institutions, Blood Donation, Adult and Non-Formal Education, Health, Nutrition, Family Welfare, AIDS awareness campaign, etc. Under "Special Camping Programme", Camp of 10 days' duration is conducted every year in the adopted areas on specific themes] like "Youth for Afforastation and Tree plantation", Youth for Rural Reconstruction", "Youth for Development", "Youth for Mass Literacy", Youth for Social Harmony", etc. The theme for the current year was "Youth for Healthy Society".
- 4. **National Discipline Scheme (NDS):** Under the scheme the Central Government meets the expenditure on the pay and allowances of the NDS instructors under the erstwhile National Fitness Corps Scheme and other incidental expenses.
- 5. **National Service Volunteers Scheme**: National Service Volunteers Scheme launched in 1977-78, aims at providing opportunities to students, generally speaking those who have completed their first degree, to involve themselves on a voluntary basis in nation building activities for a specific period, on a whole time basis.
- 6. **National Integration Programme:** Under this scheme, the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports provides assistance to Voluntary Organisations, educational institutions, NSS and NYKS for organising National Integration camps in different parts of the country, for inter-state visits, seminars, conferences, research publication, regional and zonal festivals, cultural programmes and other activities, all of which aim at combating communalism, regionalism, linguistic chauvinism and other divisive tendencies.
- 7. Youth Hostels: Youth Hostels are built to promote youth travel. Travelling enables youth to experience the diversity of the country, its natural beauty, as well as savour the glories of the past, a process which promotes National Integration. The construction of such hostels has been conceived as a joint venture between the Central and the State Govts. While the Central Govt. bears the cost of construction, the State Govt. provides the developed land free of cost with water, electricity, approach road and staff quarters.
- 8. Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development: RGNIYD is an autonomous body for youth development responsible for training, documentation, research and evaluation and extension of all youth related activities in the country.

- 9. National Reconstruction Corps Scheme: The Scheme aims at providing an opportunity to youth who have completed their matriculation to participate in the process of nation building. The NRC volunteers will be deployed by Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan on specific projects relating to community and national development. The minimum age of volunteers will be 18 years. The volunteers would get a stipend of Rs. 1000/- per month inclusive of Travel Expenses. the scheme has been launched as a Central Sector Scheme on a pilot basis for two years. In the first year 80 selected backward districts have been identified for implementation of the NRC Scheme.
- 10. Other Youth Welfare Activities: These include provision for International Exchange of Youth Delegations under culture exchange programmes, financial assistance to voluntary agencies engaged in youth welfare, National Youth Award Scheme, establishment and development of mountaineering institutions, scouting and guiding, Commonwealth Youth Programme, training of youth, youth clubs, special scheme for promotion of youth activities among backward tribes, scheme for awards to outstanding youth clubs, youth development centres and contributions to United Nation Volunteers Programmes. A number of these schemes are being revised, merged and rationalised. A seperate provision has been kept for research, evaluation and publications.
- 11. **Sports Authority of India:** SAI is an autonomous body implementing a number of plan schemes including spotting and nurturing of sports talent, promotion of sports in special areas, creation of a central pool of sports equipment, promotion of women sports, rural sports, sports scholarships, conduct of national coaching camps, establishment and management of sports hostels besides managing the stadia.
- 12. Laxmi Bai National Institute of Physical Education: The Institute has been accorded the status of a deemed university. As per University Grants Commission's directions, grants will now be released to the Institute directly for its various sports related activities.
- 13. **Grants to Sports Federations**: Grants to Sports Federation are for preparation of national teams for participation in international sports events through coaching camps, organising national championships for seniors, juniors and sub-juniors and purchase of sports equipment.
- 14. **Grants to Universities and Colleges:** Grants to universitis & Colleges are for promotion of games and sports infrastructure in the university sector. The schemes are implemented through agencies like UGC Association of Indian Universities and Sports Authority of India. It includes cost of scholarships given to talented sports persons.
- 15. Incentives for promotion of Sports Activities: A Package Incentive scheme has been devised for providing incentives to outstanding sports persons and also for giving assistance for school level competitions.
- 16. **Creation of sports Infrastructure:** The scheme is for creating facilities for organising tournaments and matches of national and international importance, developing play fields, constructing stadia, gymnasia, swimming pools, etc. The grant is based on sharing basis between Central Govt. and State Governments/sponsors.
- 17. Laying of Synthetic tracks and surfaces: In order to familiarise our teams with the use of synthetic tracks and astrosurface fields, the scheme seeks to have a net work of synthetic tracks and artificial surfaces in different regions of the country.
- 18. **Sport s Scholarship Scheme:** This Scheme is meant for inspiring talented young boys and girls at school level to develop

their aptitude towards competitive sports and to enable them to have nutritious diet.

- 19. The first Afro-Asian Games will be held at New Delhi in November, 2001.
- 20. **National Sports Development Fund**: This relates to the Scheme of the National Development Fund, which emanates from the new national Draft Sports Policy. Creating of the said fund has been mooted in the policy. It has been mentioned in the revised sports policy that a National Sports Development Fund (NSDF) will be created by Government. All contributions from within and outside the country to the fund will carry with it 100% income tax exemption. The scheme of the fund aims at providing adequate resources from the government as well as various
- governmental organisations and individuals with a view to promoting sports in the country.
- 21. **Other Schemes:** Include rural sports programmes, evaluation of sports schemes, promotion of sports among women, National Sports Championships for Women, exchange of sports and physical education team experts, and teams, grant for NCC cadets in Central Schools. A token provision has also been kept for All India Council for Physical Education.
- 23. A total provision of Rs. 21.50 crores has been included for 2000-2001 for the projects/schemes for benefit of NE Region and Sikkim. A provision of Rs. 23.45 crores has been seperately made in BE 2001-2002.
