1. **Secretariat - Social Services** - Provides for expenditure on secretariat of the Ministry.

2. **Research & Statistics** - Provides for collection and publication of statistics, conducting enquiries, surveys and research studies on various labour subjects.

3. **Industrial Relations** - Provides for expenditure incurred in connection with promotion of harmonious industrial relations and speedy implementation of labour laws, awards and agreements, laying down code of discipline etc. for improving industrial relations to regulate wage and other conditions of work and for conducting evaluatory studies of implementation of labour laws, industrial relations, personnel policies and practices etc. in public sector undertakings.

4. **Working Conditions and Safety** - Provides for Directorate General, Factory Advice Service and Labour Institutes which together are responsible for the safety, health and welfare of the dock workers and factory workers. Provision is also included for Directorate General of Mines Safety, who is responsible for the safety, health and working conditions of workers in coal and non-coal mines and oil fields.

5. **Labour Welfare Schemes** - Provides for schemes for welfare of Beedi Workers, labour working in Mica Mines, Iron, Chrome, Manganese Ore Mines (excluding coal mines workers) Limestone and Dolomite Mines Workers and Cine Workers. Expenditure is met out of cess levied and collected under the respective Labour Welfare Acts, which is transferred to Reserve Funds in the Public Account.

6. **Net Transfer to/from Labour Welfare Funds** - Represents the difference between the transfer proceeds of cess to various Labour Welfare Funds and the expenditure on Labour Welfare Scheme met from these Funds.

7. **Employees Pension Scheme, 1995** - The new scheme provides for family pension and life insurance benefits to Industrial Workers. The provision is for the Government's contribution to the new scheme.

8. **Employees Family Pension-cum-Life Insurance Scheme for Plantation Workers in Assam** - This scheme is administered through the State Government of Assam in respect of plantation workers in Assam, who are governed by the Assam Tea Plantation Provident Fund and Family Pension and Employees Deposit Linked Insurance Act administered by the Government of Assam. The provision caters for Central Government's contribution to the Scheme as also for the reimbursement of administrative charges.

9. **Central Board for Workers Education** - Central Board for Workers Education set up as a tripartite society by the Government of India in 1958 undertakes workers education activities in pursuance of the recommendations of the Fifteenth Indian Labour Conference held in 1957.

10. **National Labour Institute** - V.V. Giri National Labour Institute established in 1972 is an autonomous body under the Societies Registration Act for carrying out research including action research, education and training, consultancy, publication etc.

11. **Rehabilitation of Bonded Labour** - This is a centrally sponsored plan scheme drawn up to assist the States/Voluntary Agencies in their programmes for rehabilitation of bonded labourers.

12. This scheme is meant for the welfare of agricultural labour.

13. **Improvement in working conditions of Child/Women labour** - Provides for the formulation, co-ordination and implementation of policies and programmes concerning the welfare of child/women labour.

14. **Compensation to families of heavy duty Inter-State vehicle drivers killed in accidents**: Provision is for compensation to families/dependents of drivers driving heavy vehicles carrying goods or passengers who are killed in accidents.

15. **International Co-operation** - International Co-operation includes payment of annual subscription to International Labour Organisation (ILO), International Social Security Association and funds for providing accommodation and infrastructural facilities to the Regional Office of ILO and Asian Regional Team for Employment Promotion.

16. **Other Items** - (1) This provision is to give impetus to the development of Information Technology to further improve the efficiency in the ministry.

(2) Welfare of Emigrant Labour - Setting up of regional offices for regulation of recruitment for employment abroad, to ensure reasonable working and living conditions and to curb malpractices of the recruiting agents.

(3) Strengthening of Enforcement Machinery and payment of Pension/compensation to workers and civilians for injuries sustained during war.

(4) Grants-in-aid to Research/Academic Institutions, etc.

17. **Employment** - The employment schemes mainly cover employment market information programme, vocational guidance and employment counselling, employment assistance to certain selected category through Coaching-cum-Guidance Centres, Vocational Rehabilitation Centres for handicapped and also research and training in employment services.

18. **Training**: Under this item provision for the following schemes has been made:-

1. **Equipment Modernisation Scheme** - The scheme is intended to cater for expansion of the existing ITIs by introducing new trades to meet the demands for present and future requirements of the industries. This scheme is to be implemented as a centrally sponsored scheme on 50:50 pattern of funding.

2. **New Trades in ITIs** - The scheme is intended to cater for expansion of the existing ITIs by introducing new trades to meet the demands for present and future requirements of the industries. The scheme is to be implemented in States/UTs as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme on 50 : 50 pattern of funding.

3. **New ITIs/Wings for Women** - The scheme envisages establishment of new ITIs/Wings for Women in different States in a phased manner. The scheme is being implemented in States as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme on 50 : 50 pattern of funding.

4. **Hi-Tech Training** - The Scheme is aimed at developing new generation of workers for the High-Tech disciplines, both in operation and maintenance. This is a Central Sector Scheme.

5. **Other Schemes** - Provides for the Director General of Employment & Training, which is the apex organisation in India responsible for the development of programmes relating to the

employment service and vocational training. In addition, a number of minor schemes relating to training and employment are being implemented by the Director General of Employment & Training.

**19. Direction and Administration:** This scheme envisages deployment of personnel for specific activities of Monitoring, Implementation and design of projects under various cells/units of the entire Ministry under 'Direction and Administration' budget.

**20. Initiative to develop skills, upgrade ITIs & eliminate Child Labour during the 10th Plan:** Under this the Government of its own and with the active participation of private sector in the field of Vocational Training would undertake activities to: (i) enhance the skills of work force; (ii) Modernise and upgrade ITIs; (iii) Strengthen Labour marketing information programmes; (iv) Strengthen Women Training through tie up with Apex Training Institutes; (v) Modernize Office of the Director General of Mines Safety; (vi) Improve Labour Statistical System; and (vii) Enhance Indo-US Cooperation on eliminating Child Labour etc.

21. This lump-sum provision is for schemes under DGLB, CLC and DGET.

**22. Welfare of SC/ST** - The scheme includes Coaching-cum- Guidance Centres for SC/ST to provide confidence building training programmes and vocational guidance for candidates

belonging to that category. These Coaching - cum - Guidance Centres have been involved in pre-recruitment training courses for various nationalised Banks and agencies. Another scheme to impart refresher training to SC/ST candidates registered with the employment exchanges has also been introduced in some Coaching - cum- Guidance Centres. With a view to ensure adequate representation in various Central Government departments, special coaching is being imparted to SC/ST applicants for competitive examinations.

**23. Aid Material and Equipment** - Provides for aid from Government of Germany for (i) Central Instructional Media Institute (CIMI), Chennai and (ii) Foreman Training Institute, Bangalore which were set up with the assistance from Government of Germany in 1986 and 1971, respectively. Assistance from United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) for establishing Numerically Controlled/Computerised Numerically Controlled (NC/CNC) training facilities at Advanced Training Institutes at Chennai as also assistance from United Nations Fund for Population Activity (UNFPA) for introduction of Population Education as an integral part of social study curriculum under vocational training programme are also included.

24. This provision is for projects/schemes for the benefit of North Eastern Area and Sikkim.
