To this effect the Government has been progressively increasing the Annual Central Outlay for the Rural Water Supply Sector over the years. Rural Drinking Water is one of the components of Bharat Nirman, which has been conceived as a plan to build rural infrastructure in four years period from 2005 2006 to 2008-2009 under Rural Drinking Water Component of Bharat Nirman, it is envisaged to cover all un-covered habitations of comprehensive action plan, 1999 and also address the problem of slippage and water quality.

monitoring the water quality. Details of different models of rain water harvesting has been distributed to the States to generate more awareness about the same. A National Rural Water Quality Monitoring and Surveillance programme for institutionalising community based Water Quality Monitoring & Surveillance Systems has been finalised and is being put in place.

- 3. The Government continues to give utmost importance for supplementing the efforts of the State Governments to provide sanitation facilities to the rural masses. Sanitation Campaign Projects have been launched in 540 districts. It is proposed to cover all the districts with Total Sanitation Campaign by the end of 10th Plan.
- 4. Lump sum provision has been kept for projects/ schemes for the benefit of North Eastern States including Sikkim.
